

In addition to the master's and bachelor's degrees in human services, Purdue Global offers a Human Services Certificate in Child and Family Services. We also offer micro-credentials in Diversity and Social Problems, Prevention, and Crisis Intervention. Micro-credentials are a set of courses that develop your knowledge and skills in a specific area that can be taken as a stand-alone set of courses or within a program.



Basic Requirements

Undergraduate Applicants

You must have completed high school or received a General Equivalency Diploma (GED) or other approved equivalent.

Graduate Applicants

You must have completed a bachelor's degree program at an accredited college or university with a 2.5 cumulative grade point average (CGPA) or higher.

International Applicants

You will need to provide evidence of English language proficiency.

Transcripts from foreign institutions must meet the same requirements as domestic institutions and must be translated and evaluated by an approved foreign credential evaluator prior to enrollment.


